

**UHRICHSVILLE CITY COUNCIL**  
**Thursday, May 11, 2017**

Council President Mark Haney called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:**

**Mayor Rick Dorland:**

- Thanked the voters of Uhrichsville for passing the street levy. Hopefully the work will begin in the fall.
- Thanked Councilman Ron Miller for chairing the levy committee and thanked all the committee members.
- Would like to form a committee consisting of the Mayor, Service Director and council members to prioritize which streets to begin work on.
- Met with ODNR regarding an abandoned mine at E. Bank Street. Hopefully the work later this year will remedy the issues.
- The fire department kitchen is 95% complete.
- Dominion East Ohio will start work on the 15th on lines on Trenton Avenue.
- Will begin filling the water park this week. The warranty work in the shallow end has been completed. May 20 is work day for the water park workers. Last night had a meeting with the administration, park committee, water park manager and assistant managers. Will be upgrading signs at the water park including addition of No Smoking signs. Six new recycling cans have been purchased.
- Health Department is offering mosquito spraying at \$3.50 per minute. The Health Department has applied for a grant for mosquito spraying.
- The Clay Museum had a minor roof leak that was taken care of at no cost to the city.
- May have a leaky roof at the city building. May have to replace the ceilings in the men's and women's restrooms.
- City auction will be held later this summer to auction items that are no longer needed.
- Asked Council to approve an Ordinance as an emergency measure for refinancing the water park.
- Mrs. Davis asked when bikes would be auctioned. Mayor Dorland said they would be auctioned with other items later this summer.
- Mr. Baker asked when the official first date of the opening of the water park. Mayor Dorland said the water park would be open Memorial Day weekend and would be open seven days a week beginning June 3.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SALE OF NOTES  
IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS, OF THE CITY OF UHRICHVILLE, OHIO  
IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,655,000, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING COSTS  
OF RECONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING, ADDING TO, ENLARGING, FURNISHING, EQUIPPING AND  
OTHERWISE IMPROVING THE MUNICIPAL PARK AND SWIMMING POOL FACILITY AND RELATED  
RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, PROVIDING RELATED OFF-STREET PARKING FACILITIES, AND  
EQUIPPING AND IMPROVING THE SITES THEREOF, TOGETHER WITH ALL NECESSARY  
APPURTENANCES THERETO (THE IMPROVEMENT), IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF  
BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A NOTE PURCHASE AGREEMENT; AND  
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**
