March 14, 2013

Ms. Shirley Miller, looking on the computer, the Stillwater CIC; what are they and why are they involved in the project and where did they get the \$88,000? And why are we now just hearing about this and why isn't it in black and white? We have heard about an indoor swimming pool and a bowling alley. Mr. Peterson said he had been invited to the CIC meeting and Mr. Van Epps is here; Mr. Van Epps, Executive Director of the CIC; we are non-profit status and are awaiting our approval for a 501C3 which will be tax exempt. We are just proposing projects now and awaiting our 501C3 status before we can do anything. Ms. Miller asked why haven't we heard about you and Dennison has a football field they are not using. Mr. Van Epps said we approached Dennison and they are doing it themselves. Mr. Van Epps invited Ms. Miller to a meeting, they are the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. at 115 Hannah Street, Dennison.

Donna Moody, Claymont Public Library Director, she introduced Tim Leist, an Architect from MKC. This summer they will be renovating the (face) of the library and do some interior renovations. The library is funding the project.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

Mayor Culbertson, received contracts from Quicksall, will review later in meeting; received the ordinance from the jail to transport prisoners; received a letter from Quicksall which grants are available; In February there were 582 police calls and 19 fire calls; Police Chief has been busy getting rid of records, dated as far back as 1948.; he received the email from Law Director Doug O'Meara regarding the property on E. 6th Street; There will be a conference call next Tuesday @ 10:30 with the people from Wash DC., their plan and suggestions will be reviewed at that time; Mr. Gyurko asked how many times do we use the county jail to house prisoners? Mayor said he doesn't know but anytime we apprehend someone they go there. Mrs. Davis wanted the Mayor to know there was a sign on Eastport on a residence for a business, the Mayor said that was legal. President Mr. Donato asked last year there was grants available for tearing down houses, where did that money go? Mayor said there was somewhere around \$288,000 for that and Uhrichsville submitted 41 houses but only 2 homeowners responded. The Mayor said we receive no money for this; asbestos testing as to be done at every home; we get reimbursed for any money we spend.
