#### **Visitors:**

Wayne Hicks, 6234 S. Water St. Ext.:

Lives at an intersection on S. Water St. Ext. Mr. Hicks stated there is a full blown problem with stop sign violations and he doesn't feel safe in the city and believes something needs to be done. He challenged council to sit at the intersection for an extended period of time although he understands it goes on at other places. He has called the police and feels they think he's psycho. Mr. Haney told him that there are only one or two officers on duty at a time and they cover 95 miles of citywide property. Mayor Dorland said that he spoke with Mr. Hicks two months ago and personally watched for 1 ½ hours and didn't see one violation. The Mayor assured that the police do patrol the area but can't be everywhere at once. Traffic cameras were discussed but Mayor Dorland didn't feel they were cost effective. Mr. Bollon reported that there is an outfit out of Columbus that provides solar powered cameras at no cost to the city. The camera records the

violation, a ticket is issued and the fine is paid to the company with a percentage going to the city. Mr. Bollon will get more information and present to council. Mr. Miller said that he lives on Washington Avenue and sees the same violations and notices when the police are there no violations happen. Mr. Hicks doesn't blame the police, but feels that the violations need to be enforced. Mr. Haney said that the Mayor and Mr. Bollon will look into and make a presentation to

Debra Westhafer, 200 Claymont Dr., Apt. 208:

Concerned about the bumps on the Trenton Avenue hill which caused her car to be out of line. Mayor Dorland said the service department has tried to fill in the holes. He lives on the west side and hits them too. The city unfortunately cannot afford to pave, but he may send the service department there again to fill holes. A discussion was held as to whether or not the property belongs to the city or to the county. Brett Hillyer said that he had looked on the deed and the parcel numbers and none of them make sense. Mark Haney said this has been a long debate with the county, and he doesn't believe it is the city's property.

Andrea Nalley, 521 Fuhr Street, Dennison

She takes care of the weeds around the memorial at the park one or two times a week. She also takes the debris to the trash cans. She suggested that next summer a job is offered to some kids to weed the park in exchange for water park passes.

She also talked to the mayor about the bricks bowing on the old Wheeler office building and feels it needs roped off because it's dangerous. Mr. Bollon said that it is private property and he looked at and the owner has contacted a contractor and repairs are in the works.

Mr. Bollon thanked Ms. Nalley for her work at the park and likes her idea.

There may be a Harcatus program that will provide workers at the park for maintenance next year.

#### Fireman Dillon

9/3 - 9/5 will be the third annual fundraiser for MDA. \$3,400.00 was raised two years ago with \$6,200.00 raised last year. It will be on 11<sup>th</sup> and Water.
